2014 Barolo

Wine Spectator 90 pts – Bruce Sanderson

Shows density and square shoulders, along with cherry, plum, tobacco, earth and tar flavors. The brooding nature builds on the firm, dusty finish. Best from 2023 through 2042. 1,600 cases made.

Vinous 93 pts – Antonio Galloni

Seghesio's 2014 Barolo is a gorgeous, super-expressive wine. Sweet tobacco, mint, crushed flowers and anise give the 2014 its gracious floral/savory profile. Medium in body and nicely lifted, the 2014 will drink well for at least a number of years. All the elements come together effortlessly in a wine that captures the essence of the year. At times, the 2014 Barolo seems a bit forward, but its balance is impeccable. I wouldn't wait too long to enjoy this very pretty and inviting Barolo from Seghesio.

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2014 Barolo La Villa

James Suckling 92 pts

Tar and leather aromas and flavors here. Chewy tannins and a savory finish. A little tough now but nothing that a few years of bottle age won't sort out. Try in 2020.

Wine Spectator 89 pts – Bruce Sanderson

Aromas of hay, mustard and cherry mark this savory red, with cherry and cranberry flavors that segue to tobacco and dusty chocolate notes. The beefy tannins lend support. Best from 2022 through 2038. 500 cases made.

Vinous 92 pts – Antonio Galloni

The 2014 Barolo La Villa is laced with dark cherry, plum, woodsmoke, cedar, tobacco and licorice. Pliant and deep, the 2014 is impeccably layered from start to finish. The La Villa is a bit richer and darker than the straight Barolo, but both wines share a profile that leans more towards the floral/savory end of the spectrum, with the fruit pushed into the background.

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2015 Barolo La Villa

James Suckling 93 pts

Light and bright strawberries and gently peppery elements, as well as light rose perfume. The palate delivers some plump, fleshy fruit with ripe tannins carrying red-cherry flavor in pure, youthful mode. Drink from 2022.

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2017 Barbera d'Alba

Wine Spectator 89 pts- Bruce Sanderson

This red shows density and a lightly grainy texture framing the black cherry and blackberry fruit. Flashes of earth and mineral add depth. Pair with roasted rabbit or pheasant. Drink now through 2023.

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2017 Dolcetto d'Alba

Wine Spectator 93 pts

This is firm in structure, the dusty tannins shoring up blackberry, pomegranate and earth flavors. The lightly astringent finish will fare better with some fatty food. Drink now through 2022.

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2016 Barbera d'Alba La Chiesa

Vinous 90 pts

The 2016 Barbera d'Alba La Chiesa is rich and a touch rough around the edges, but also quite pleasing in its own way. Super-ripe red cherry and spice notes are pushed forward in this lush, super-expressive Barbera.

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
